

VBS Kreativ-Set „Adventskalender Schachteln“

Instructions No. 1048



This Advent Calendar is made of 24 small boxes, which you can lovingly decorate

The different patterns of the paper block can be combined in many ways and get a noble shine through the beads and the filigree numbers. The small boxes can be used to hide lovingly selected small items for the Christmas season.

Have you ever thought of giving away little sayings and vouchers? This way your Advent Calendar is guaranteed to become a very personal unique specimen.

And it is as simple as that:

Glue six boxes on top of each other to get four blocks of boxes. Now glue a sheet Paper over one side of the box opening in the appropriate width by gluing it to the top and bottom. Do this for all blocks. Now place the four trestles with the box opening in front of you. Now turn the blocks so that the openings all look in different directions. Now put the blocks together and glue them on their backs

Cut out two squares from the block for the top and bottom of the calendar cube and glue them on

Now decorate your Advent Calendar according to your wishes with the motives of the block by gluing different cut-outs on the sides of the box and the small box fronts. When everything has dried well, attach the beads to the pull-outs with wire by twirling the ends together in the inside of the drawer. You can also use a small needle to prick the holes

Now detach the Advent calendar numbers from the sheet and fix them on the calendar. If the numbers appear too delicate, you can use tweezers to do so.

This idea is timelessly beautiful!
